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1. Mission, Vision, and Values

2. District Information

3. Enrollment and Registration

New Student Enrollment:

To enroll a new student, parents/guardians must provide the following documents:

- i. Birth certificate

- ii. Proof of residency (utility bill, lease agreement, etc.)
- iii. Up-to-date immunization records
- iv. Transcript/records from previous school (if applicable)

Registration for Returning Students:

Families of returning students must complete the annual online registration process before the start of each school year. This ensures we have the most up-to-date information on file.

4. Attendance Policies

Regular school attendance is essential for student success. The Amazon Demo School District attendance policy is as follows:

Excused Absences:

- i. Illness
- ii. Medical/dental appointments
- iii. Family emergency
- iv. Religious observance
- v. Pre-approved educational/family trip

Unexcused Absences:

- i. Oversleeping
- ii. Missing the bus
- iii. Personal business
- iv. Non-emergency family travel

Parents/guardians must notify the school office by 9 AM on the day of an absence. Students are responsible for making up any missed work.

Tardiness: Students are expected to arrive at school on time. Excessive tardiness may result in disciplinary action.

Early Dismissal: If a student needs to leave school early, a parent/guardian must sign them out in the school office. Photo ID may be required.

5. Academic Programs and Policies

Curriculum and Instruction:

The Amazon Demo School District curriculum is aligned to state standards and designed to promote college and career readiness. Instructional practices emphasize active, engaging learning experiences.

Grading and Assessment:

- Elementary (K-5): Standards-based grading on a 4-point scale
- Middle (6-8) and High School (9-12): A-F letter grades

Students participate in state standardized testing, as well as district-level assessments to monitor progress.

Homework and Make-Up Work:

Reasonable homework assignments are given to reinforce learning. Students are responsible for completing any missed work due to absences.

Promotion and Retention:

Students must meet grade-level academic standards to be promoted to the next grade. Retention decisions are made collaboratively between the school and parents.

Special Programs:

- i. English Learner (EL) Services
- ii. Special Education

6. Student Conduct and Discipline

Student Code of Conduct:

The Amazon Demo School District has high expectations for student behavior to maintain a safe, orderly learning environment. The student code of conduct outlines rules, responsibilities, and potential consequences.

Student Conduct Expectations

Students enrolled in the Amazon Demo School District are expected to:

- i. Behave in a manner that is conducive to learning and does not disrupt the educational environment.
- ii. Treat fellow students, teachers, administrators, and school staff with respect, courtesy, and kindness.
- iii. Follow all school rules, regulations, and procedures.
- iv. Attend school regularly and arrive on time.
- v. Complete assigned coursework and homework to the best of their ability.
- vi. Respect school property and the property of others.
- vii. Refrain from bullying, harassment, or any other behavior that could threaten the safety or well-being of others.
- viii. Dress appropriately for the school environment.
- ix. Abstain from the use or possession of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or weapons on school grounds or at school-sponsored events.

Prohibited Behaviors

The following behaviors are prohibited by Amazon Demo School District:

- i. Bullying/Harassment
- ii. Fighting/Violence
- iii. Possession of Weapons

- iv. Alcohol/Drug Violations
- v. Disruptive Behavior
- vi. Academic Dishonesty

Disciplinary Measures:

The Amazon Demo School District will implement a range of disciplinary measures to address student misconduct, including but not limited to:

1. Verbal warnings and redirection
2. Temporary removal from the classroom
3. Detention before or after school
4. In-school suspension
5. Out-of-school suspension
6. Expulsion

The specific disciplinary measure(s) applied will depend on the nature and severity of the misconduct, as well as the student's prior disciplinary history. In all cases, the school administration will strive to implement disciplinary measures that are fair, consistent, and effective in modifying student behavior.

Due Process

Students facing disciplinary action will be afforded due process, including the opportunity to:

1. Be informed of the alleged misconduct and the potential consequences.
2. Present their side of the story and any relevant evidence.
3. Appeal disciplinary decisions to the appropriate school administrator or the district's Board of Education.

Parental Involvement

The Amazon Demo School District recognizes the important role that parents/guardians play in shaping student behavior and supporting the school's disciplinary efforts. Parents/guardians will be notified of any significant disciplinary actions taken against their child and will be encouraged to collaborate with the school to address behavioral issues.

7. Health and Safety

Health Services

A. School Nurse

- i. Each school within the district will have a licensed school nurse on staff during all operational hours.
- ii. The school nurse will be responsible for:
 - a. Providing basic medical care and first aid to students and staff as needed.
 - b. Administering prescribed medications to students in accordance with parental/guardian consent and physician instructions.
 - c. Maintaining accurate health records for all students.
 - d. Monitoring student immunization compliance and notifying parents/guardians of any deficiencies.
 - e. Coordinating with local health authorities to address any communicable disease

outbreaks or public health concerns. f. Providing health education and promotion activities for students and staff.

B. Health Screenings

- i. The district will conduct the following mandatory health screenings for students:
 - a. Vision and hearing tests annually for all students.
 - b. Scoliosis screenings for students in grades 5-8.
- ii. Parents/guardians will be notified of any health concerns identified during the screening process and provided with recommended follow-up actions.

Safety Protocols

A. Emergency Preparedness

- i. The district will maintain a comprehensive Emergency Operations Plan that addresses a variety of potential emergency situations, including natural disasters, accidents, and acts of violence.
- ii. All schools will conduct regular emergency drills, including fire, lockdown, and evacuation drills, to ensure staff and students are prepared to respond appropriately.
- iii. The district will provide training for staff on emergency response procedures and the implementation of the Emergency Operations Plan.

B. Visitor Management

- i. All visitors to school facilities must check in at the main office and provide valid identification.
- ii. Visitors will be issued a visitor's pass that must be visibly worn at all times while on campus.
- iii. The district reserves the right to refuse entry or escort any visitor off campus who fails to comply with visitor management procedures or poses a threat to the safety of students and staff.

C. Facility Maintenance

- i. The district will regularly inspect all school facilities and grounds to identify and address any potential safety hazards.
- ii. Necessary repairs and maintenance will be promptly completed to ensure the structural integrity and safe operation of all buildings, equipment, and systems.

Immunization Requirements

A. Student Immunization Compliance

- i. All students enrolled in the Amazon Demo School District must provide proof of up-to-date immunizations as required by state law, unless they have a valid medical or religious exemption on file.
- ii. The school nurse will monitor student immunization records and notify parents/guardians of any deficiencies.
- iii. Students who do not comply with immunization requirements may be excluded from attending school until the necessary immunizations are obtained.

8. Transportation

Bus Transportation:

Free bus transportation is provided for eligible students living beyond a specified distance from their assigned school. Buses operate on set routes and schedules.

Student Expectations:

Students must follow all bus rules and listen to the driver's instructions. Misconduct may result in suspension of bus privileges.

Parking and Student Drivers:

High school students may purchase a parking permit to drive to school and park on campus. All student drivers must follow campus traffic and parking regulations.

9. Technology and Digital Resources

The Amazon Demo School District is committed to leveraging technology to enhance the educational experience for all students and support the instructional and administrative needs of the district. The following is an overview of the technology services and resources available within the Amazon Demo School District:

Student Devices and Learning Platforms

A. 1-to-1 Student Device Program

- a. All students in grades 3-12 are provided with a district-issued Chromebook to use for academic purposes.

- d. Families must sign an acceptable use policy. Inappropriate use may result in disciplinary action.

B. Learning Management System (LMS)
